Retention and Graduation Data

In 1998, 23,841 new first-time freshmen entered Virginia's public four-year institutions. At the end of six years, 15,521 (65.1%) had completed a four-year baccalaureate degree at the same institutions from where they had started. This rate has climbed steadily from 58% in 1983 to the current level. For students finishing at any institution, the overall rate was about 69%.

For VCCS, the rate is 14% which represents not only the distinctive mission of the VCCS, but the differences in its student body from that of the four-year institutions. However, 42% of VCCS students advance through continued study in the VCCS, transfer to a four-year institution, or graduation over a three-year period.

Richard Bland College students, through preparation and eventual transfer, complete baccalaureate degrees at an average rate of 36%.

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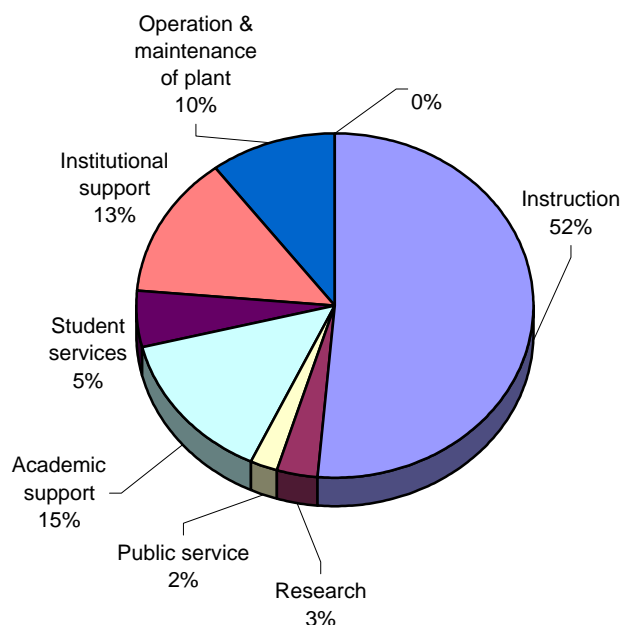
